In order to receive this scholarship, you must turn in an application with the registration for the event!

#### Russell County 4-H Development Fund Eulert 4-H Camp Scholarship

This scholarship is available to any Midway-Russell County 4-H Member who is attending the Rock Springs Ranch 4-H Camp. The 4-H member must tell at least one group of youth about their camping experience and report their presentation to the Extension Office by September 30th of the current 4-H year. Applications are DUE August 1st.

#### Russell County 4-H Development Fund Event Scholarship

This scholarship is available to any Midway-Russell County 4-H Member attending a 4-H Event. The 4-H member must tell at least one group of your about their experience and report their presentation to the Extension Office by August 1st of the current 4-H year. #### **Ellsworth 4-H Council Scholarship Application**

The Ellsworth 4-H Council offers an event scholarship that can be applied for by 4-H members.

- Submit the application two weeks prior to event or at time of event registration deadline
- Applications received later than 30 days following the event will not be honored.
- Recipient must give a presentation to local 4-H club or 4-H council following the event.
- Scholarship check will be issued after the presentation is verified by local 4-H club leader or Extension Agent.
- A 4-Her may receive no more than \$150\* in total event scholarships each year (October 1- September 30). You may only request up to 1/3 of the total cost of each event.
- Rock Springs Ranch 4-H Camp attendees will be awarded not more than \$50.
- National 4-H events do not count toward the \$125 cap and are considered on an as needed basis.



Many of the events and paperwork- most definitely the paperwork- for 4-H can be overwhelming for new 4-H families! This page will be used to highlight things that may be helpful to know in regard to upcoming events, deadlines, and necessary documents. Your Club Leader is also a great resource!

#### Online Record Keeping with Z-Books

Youth may choose to use either record keeping option: a.) the fillable PDF Project report forms or b.) the online ZBooks software

The Permanent Record is included in ZBooks. If you choose to keep records with ZBooks, do not feel like you have to transfer over all of your previous years' activities into the online Permanent Record. Start with this year and attach it to your previous document.

Zbooks is an online record keeping software and is identical to the New Project Report Form pdf - meaning 4-Her's and families now have the option to choose which format they feel most comfortable using. Families can continue to fill out the form fillable pdf version of Project Report Forms or they may opt to keep their records online with ZBooks. Both are evaluated using the same rubric and the same set of standards.

Some features of ZBooks:

- Mobile friendly jot down notes, weights, ear tags, expenses, etc on the spot
- Internet based you can work on them from any device that is connected to the internet
- Unlimited amount of entries until final report is submitted youth select the allowed number of entries to print on final report, allowing them to summarize and prioritize
- Permanent Record is also included
- Extension staff have the ability to view member's progress, send reminders, upload local forms, etc.
- Adult Volunteers may receive viewing rights for members in their clubs and/or project areas so they too can track progress, coach and encourage record keeping
- Live online ZBooks chat feature

#### What is the Favorite Foods Show?

The Favorite Foods show combines planning an event with learning about nutritional value and setting a table. The Extension Office has a handbook that can provide additional information. This can be found <u>HERE</u>.

- Pick a dish that is your favorite! It can represent any course of a meal. You will need to have the recipe turned in by January 8th.
  - Pick a theme and create an event based off of your recipe.
- Plan your place setting (card table-sized) to tie into your theme.
- Plan your menu around your theme and particular favorite recipe.
- On January 19th, you will set up your place setting, include your menu, and prepare your selected recipe. During a consultative judging, you will have the opportunity to share your idea, recipe, and place setting with a judge for constructive feedback.

#### **Favorite Foods Show coming January 19!**

\*\*4-H Council—as you select representatives from your club for 4-H Council, please remind them of the responsibility and expectations of serving as a Council representative. This is the opportunity to share information at Council with your club and bring information back from Council to each club meeting.

#### What is Club Day?

Club Day is an opportunity for 4-H members to demonstrate their talents in several different areas in front of judges and other 4-H members and families. Club Day will be held Sunday, February 23. Members must be enrolled in 4-H Online by December 1 to participate in Club Day. Club Day entries are due to the extension office by Wednesday, January 22. There is also a handbook for this available at the Extension office and on our website HERE.
